
Course Title: Trados Business Manager for Administrators and Project Managers

The course will first focus on the administrative tasks, then will address topics relevant to Project Managers.

The course will be split into 2 distinct parts:

- The second part will be aimed at Project Managers. If they haven't participated in the first part, Project Managers will be introduced to the TBM User Interface, then will be shown how to use the application.
